EARLY IN-PERSON VOTING BEGINS 2020 GENERAL ELECTION

LOS ANGELES (October 23, 2020) — Los Angeles City Clerk Holly L. Wolcott reminds eligible voters that the in-person voting period for the November 3, 2020, General Election begins on Saturday, October 24. Although all registered voters in California will be receiving a Vote by Mail ballot for the General Election, safe in-person voting will still be available. State and County public health and safety guidelines will be strictly followed. Voters will be required to wear masks and adhere to social distancing guidelines and other measures.

CONDITIONAL VOTER REGISTRATION:

Eligible Los Angeles County residents who missed the October 19 registration deadline can still vote at any Vote Center in L.A. County. Under California Election Law, Conditional Voter Registration (CVR) allows a prospective voter to conditionally register and cast a ballot. HOW AND WHERE TO VOTE:

For the November 3, General Election, voters will have three options to cast their ballots.

- **At a Vote Center:** Voters can cast or drop-off their voted ballot at any Vote Center throughout the County. Select Vote Centers will be open as early as October 24 and all Vote Centers will be open beginning on October 30. Voters will receive three mailers, their Sample Ballot, a booklet of all Vote Center locations, and a postcard identifying the three closest Vote Center locations and Official Ballot Drop Boxes. - **At an Official Ballot Drop Box:** Voters can securely drop off their voted ballot at any of the over 400 Drop Box locations throughout the County through Election Day. Find the nearest locations at <https://locator.lavote.net/locations/vbm/>.
- **By Mail:** Voters can mail their ballot. Please note the United States Postal Service (USPS) recommends returning ballots early to avoid any possible delays. However, if a ballot is postmarked by November 3, Election Day and received within 17 days, it will be accepted.

The City's General Election will be held November 3, 2020. While the City conducted the candidate filing portion of the Elections, the County will administer the Elections.
