RESIDENCE DEADLINE FOR CANDIDATES 2022 LOS ANGELES MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

(December 30, 2021)— Los Angeles City Clerk Holly L. Wolcott reminds all candidates who wish to run for City elected offices in the June 7, 2022 City of Los Angeles Primary Nominating Election, that they must reside in the applicable jurisdiction or district in which they are running for office by Saturday, January 8, 2022.

Candidates for Citywide seats (Mayor, Controller, City Attorney), must be residents within the City of Los Angeles by this date. Candidates for City Council Districts (1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, and 15) and candidates for the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) Board of Education Districts (2, 4, and 6) must be residents within their respective Districts by this date. The deadline is set by City Charter as 30 days preceding February 7, 2022, which is the first day that candidates can file a Declaration of Intention to Become a Candidate. Failure to meet the above residency requirement will disqualify candidates from running for office.

Additionally, to be eligible for election to the City elected offices of Mayor, Controller, City Attorney, and Council, a candidate must be a registered voter within the City. Candidates for LAUSD must be registered voters within LAUSD.

Please note, as a result of the 2020 Census, new district lines have taken effect for the 2022 Municipal Elections. Updated City Council and LAUSD maps are available at the links below:
