NEW MURAL TO CELEBRATE LOCAL PARKS

Buellton has been made brighter by community pride as locals mobilized to beautify the town with an elaborate set of murals celebrating local parks. Four 8-foot by 8-foot murals depicting four of Buellton parks — the Santa Ynez Botanic Garden, PAWS Park, River View Park and Zaca Creek Golf Course — were affixed to the west-facing wall of the Postal Annex building located on Highway 246.

The project was officially unveiled for the public during a dedication ceremony Saturday, July 17th. The four parks, were chosen because of their location off the beaten path, away from the town's main throughway. The murals not only celebrate

that "Buellton is a small community with beautiful vistas and places to visit" but also serve as an advertisement to passersby.

The beautification project was sponsored by the Buellton Arts and Culture Committee and is part of an ongoing communitywide effort to celebrate Buellton's history and landscapes through the arts.

Treated Wood—Temporary Order

Beginning on January 1, 2020, Santa Barbara County waste facilities will temporarily NOT accept Treated Wood Waste (TWW) due to regulatory changes that are affecting the State of California. The county is in the process of acquiring the new certification needed to handle this waste and are expecting the CA Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) to provide further guidance in early 2021. Keeping Buellton Beautiful - Parking of trailers, boats, dumpsters and other vehicles without self-propelled power- Parking Restrictions (BMC 10.01.030)

For those trailers and other vehicles without self-propelled power that seem to be parked on the curb forever, the applicable code is: No person shall park a trailer, boat. dumpster or other vehicle without any means of selfpropulsion for more than twenty-four (24) consecutive hours in any seventy-two (72) consecutive hour period, in any location on any residential highway, street or alley. 

STORMWATER TIP — AUGUST 2021

Did you know there are Mutt Mitt stations located throughout the City of Buellton that make it easy to pick up after your dog? There are 14 total stations including 5 conveniently located stations in River View Park, 3 stations in Oak Park, and 1 on the Oak Valley Elementary School fence along Via Corona. You may have noticed the new signs along the fence at Via Corona as well. These signs are there to remind you to do your part while walking your four-legged friend and "Close the Poop Loop." While out for a stroll, please remember to keep our parks and sidewalks clean for everyone to enjoy by using the nearby bag stations and trash cans to pick up after your pet.

Like fertilizer, oil, and sediment, pet waste is considered a non-point source pollutant by the Environmental Protection Agency. Pet waste contains nutrients like nitrogen and phosphorus that can fuel toxic algal blooms and reduce oxygen levels in water. If left on the grass, rain will wash these nutrients into storm drains and local waterways, harming the plants and wildlife that live there.
