Santa Barbara County Animal Services would to remind all pet owners to keep their pet's vaccinations, including rabies up to date and current. Rabies is a preventable viral disease that is transmitted through the bite of a rabid animal. Rabies can pass from wild animals to pets. Although transmission to humans is rare, it is fatal if not treated.

Rabies vaccinations are recommended for all domestic animals including cats, dogs, horses and livestock. Santa Barbara County residents and their pets often live in close contact with wildlife. Residents can protect their pets by keeping them indoors at night, walking them with a leash, scanning the yard before allowing them outside and not leaving out food that will attract wildlife.

Symptoms of rabies can include agitation, biting and snapping, drooling, acting disoriented, appearing partially paralyzed or generally acting sick.
