





2020 was a challenging year for us, as people and as a Tribal Nation. It has required us to work together to navigate the historic COVID-19 pandemic and find the best ways to serve our citizens. I feel Tribal Council has made some great choices, such as the General Welfare Act, which significantly helped our citizens. Working together as a team we've strengthened our resilience and identified where we can improve our response to emergencies that we may face in the future, making Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation even stronger.

Among the many challenges, one of the biggest we faced was the closure our main source of income, the L7 Casino. Tribal Council worked together to do what was necessary to maintain obligations until we could re-open safely. As the CARES ACT funding became available, we again worked closely with our fiscal department to ensure that all of the strict guidelines and requirements were met, while serving the needs of our Tribal citizens.

I would like to explore creating a Tribal structural fire department, and a wildland fire team for the protection and safety of our people and our lands.

I continue to advocate for the IRS Section 17 Charter. This will help the Nation with economic development and creating additional revenue streams of income.

Protecting the health and safety of our Tribal youth who are our future leaders is important to me and I will continue to advocate for them in the future.

Researching historical land and genealogy documents has always been a passion of mine. I will continue to find ways to rebuild the relationship with our lands while working with county, State and Federal agencies to secure our sovereignty.



TOLOWA DEE-NI' NATION ACTIVELY SEEKS ANCESTRAL LANDS

As the original inhabitants and stewards of the Smith River Plain and Estuary the Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation has been presented with a quintessential opportunity to return a critical portion of our unceded ancestral territory back under the rightful ownership and management of the Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation. Reservation Ranch is located on the lower Smith River, and lies in the heart of the original 40,000 acre Smith River Indian Reservation of 1862. This land was secured by our ancestors through negotiations with California State Representatives who signed a Peace Treaty in 1855; however, neither the 1855 Treaty nor the 1862 Reservation were upheld, forcing our people to relocate from their homes and sacred place of Genesis. The property is currently for sale by the long-standing owners and is the subject of regulatory oversight for alleged extensive and egregious California Coastal Act, California State Water Resources Control Board, and National Marine Fisheries Services violations resulting from current and past land management activities.

The Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation is actively seeking support, allies and comments to assist in the reclamation of this sacred land for the purposes of restoring the natural habitat and diverse ecosystems, resulting in the protection and perpetuation of natural and cultural resources. You may be eligible for some of the following programs: •

Burial Assistance:

Available to all Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation Tribal Citizens

• There is a max allowance of \$3,500 for assistance. **IF**, there are funds left over, the remaining balance may be awarded to an heir, or next of kin to the deceased.

Catastrophic Emergency Assistance:

Available to Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation Tribal Citizens who reside in our 5 county service area ONLY (Coos, Curry, Josephine, Del Norte and Humboldt)

- Payment may be provided to individuals or families who suffer fire, flood, or other destruction of their home and loss or damage to personal possessions. TDN will make payments only for essential needs and other non-medical necessities.
 - TDN Citizen must be 18 years and older
 - Primary residence of the applicant, provide verification
 - Primary residence is within the 5 county service area
 - Apply within two (2) weeks of home disaster

Elder Emergency Assistance:

Available to Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation Tribal Citizens who reside in our 5 county service area ONLY (Coos, Curry, Josephine, Del Norte and Humboldt)

 Completed and accepted applications will be eligible for a maximum allowance of \$500 per calendar year, to use towards an emergency situation. Requests should be discussed with CFS staff before purchase of any items to allow us to verify the need for a replacement item. If an elder purchases fuel or similar items and wishes to apply for reimbursement, this must be within two (2) weeks of purchase.

General Assistance:

Available to Tolowa Dee-ni' Tribal Citizens who reside in our 5 county service area ONLY (Coos, Curry, Josephine, Del Norte and Humboldt)

• Provides financial assistance to eligible Tribal Citizens with a goal

to increase self-sufficiency. This is accomplished through specific steps an individual will take to increase independence as outlined in his/her Individual Self-Sufficiency Plan (ISP)

*May receive up to three (3) months of assistance per calendar year.

Medical Assistance (includes hospitalization, medical travel and consecutive/long-term therapy):

Available to all Tolowa Dee-ni' Tribal Citizens

Medical Assistance Grant Awards, annual maximum allowance shall not exceed \$750.

- \$75 for trips one-way from 50 199 miles, or \$150 for trips oneway from 200 + miles, from a Tribal Citizens home.
- Payments are not made retro actively; Tribal Citizens have the responsibility to request assistance prior to appointment date, or in the case of an emergency, ten (10) business days of the appointment.
- Hospitalization Assistance: Available for members or their spouse who are hospitalized. Members or their spouses are eligible for \$100 a day after a verified hospitalization of three (3) consecutive days; up to, and not to exceed, \$1,000 for inpatient treatment. Limited to one per calendar year per member.
- Consecutive Treatment/Long Term Therapy: available for certain life threatening conditions including, but not limited to, cancer, renal failure, neurological disorders and coronary heart disease. Limited to one per calendar year per member.



- Tribal Citizen must complete an NCIDC LIHEAP application and submit information specified on application; along with energy bill.
- NCIDC will verify information, approve or deny request.

We plan to start off our videos with teaching how to sound out the alphabet, using different acknowledgments when meeting someone, and introducing one's self. Over the course of the next couple months, our videos will have guest speakers such as native elders and youth that will feature traditional story-telling and singing. We want to show short clips of every day conversation so people can use the language within their home and daily life by using full sentences that are readily accessible. We also plan to share videos of different village locations and gathering techniques for the spring and summer season coming soon. Throughout all of this, we will be frequently editing and updating our YouTube channel content while providing our audience with the correct way of writing and sentence structure. Our final goal is to make our videos enjoyable and easy to understand. We want the curriculum to be user friendly from the beginner to the advanced speaker.

Our staff remain dedicated to safety guidelines regarding the COVID-19 virus. The trainings and large majority of meetings associated with this project remain web based. We look forward to and are planning for when these protocols are lifted. The project is still operating on schedule with our grant related goals for 2021. I am excited that we are in the hiring process for the Family Liaison openings. Thank you to the HR Department for their time and energy through this process. We received many applications and conducted interviews via zoom for the two Family Liaison positions. Please stay tuned to next month's edition for their introduction columns.





I am currently participating in a cosmetology apprenticeship through TNN Apprenticeships. TNN Apprenticeships is based out of Woodland, California. Although I am going through TNN Apprenticeships, I will be completing my hours at a local salon called Local Roots Salon in Crescent City. A cosmetology apprenticeship is approximately a two-year course. Once I have completed all of my hours and required tasks, I will be eligible to take my board exam. After I pass my board exam I will be a licensed cosmetologist and can work anywhere in California with my license. I plan to stay at Local Roots Salon after I am done with my Apprenticeship. I am so grateful to have support from family, friends, and the Tolowa



Dee-ni' Nation. If it weren't for the Higher Education program this wouldn't have even been a possibility for me.



The Education Department has been working on two grants. Zak'ry Conger has been hired as the Project Manager for the Demonstration

grant. We will be interviewing for two Family Liaison positions the second week of March. One of the first tasks that the Demo staff will work on is the student portal of education and enrichment services for both Del Norte and Curry Counties.

Karlie Scott and Chuski Scott have been hired for the BIA Living Languages Grant. The first goal is to start creating our first video and to plan what the next few months will look like. Over the course of the next few months, our videos will have guest speakers such as native elders and youth that will feature traditional story-telling and singing. We will be frequently editing and updating our YouTube channel while providing our audience with the correct way of writing and sentence structure. Our final goal is to make our videos enjoyable and easy to understand. We want the curriculum to be user friendly from the beginner to the advanced speaker.


The Education Department partnered with Frontier Communications to provide Chromebooks to all TDN youth ages 5-18 living in Del Norte and Curry counties. We received 235 Chromebooks with covers our enrolled Tribal youth. Frontier Communications has the main focus of **low-income** students in **grades of 6 through 12**. Once these students receive their Chromebooks, then the rest may be distributed to our remaining Tribal youth. Frontier Communications said that additional Chromebooks will be available to Tribes once the initial distribution ends. Parents and students must sign agreements for the Chromebooks. The agreements are for student safety. The Education Department has an additional goal of increasing online school attendance rates for our Tribal students.

We are currently working on the CTAS grant through the planning office. This grant, if awarded, will allow the Education Department to offer a youth recreation program similar to Boys and Girls Club but locally controlled and programmed with our own staff.

BOOK OF THE MONTH

One Sunday in the spring of 1988, a woman living on a reservation in North Dakota is attacked. The details of the crime are slow to surface because Geraldine Coutts is traumatized and reluctant to relive or reveal what happened, either to the police or to her husband, Bazil, and thirteen-year-old son, Joe. In one day, Joe's life is irrevocably transformed. He tries to heal his mother, but she will not leave her bed and slip into an abyss of solitude. Increasingly alone, Joe finds himself thrust prematurely into an adult world for which he is ill prepared.

While his father, a tribal judge, endeavors to wrest justice from a situation that defies his efforts, Joe becomes frustrated with the official investigation and sets out with his trusted friends, Cappy, Zack, and Angus, to get some answers of his own. Their quest takes them first to the Round House, a sacred space and place of worship for the Ojibwe. And this is only the beginning.





TOLOWA LANGUAGE PROGRAM

Instruction at Del Norte High School (DNHS) has switched to 4th, 5th and 6th periods being taught every day for the next 9 weeks. Followed by 1st, 2nd and 3rd period being taught for the last 9 weeks of the school year. Instruction has switched to in-person cohorts. Students attend in person on Tuesday and Thursday or Monday and Wednesday. When they are not attending in person they attend on Zoom. All students are attending Fridays on Zoom.

Currently Tolowa Dee-ni' Wee-ya' 1 and 2 are being taught at Del Norte High School.

In Tolowa 1 there are 13 Students enrolled.

In Tolowa 2 There are 9 students enrolled.

This class is held during 1st period and will be taught during the second 9 week period of instruction at DNHS.

Native American Studies is also being taught at Del Norte High School.

In Native American Studies there are 22 students enrolled.

Current instruction includes Indian Boarding Schools, the effect of Indian Boarding Schools on Native American Languages and Culture, The Dawes Act, Tribal Government formation and Fishing Rights in the Pacific Northwest.

Counseling Services Available

Michael Harling and Kathleen Daignault have been working with clients through a few crisis. Michael and Kathleen have helped their clients by developing a plan to have the clients to help each other as support when they can. During this period we have had no relapses. We have one client returning to the program and 6 new referrals. We started off serving 30 client at the beginning of this month (March). We have not lost any clients this month. Kathleen and Michael have 8 new clients as well. We are still serving client as far north as Gold Beach and south to Klamath Glen.

We are expanding our curriculum to include youth age 13 and up, and co-occurring disorders, which means people that have substance abuse disorder AND mental health issues.

Kathleen and Michael would like to reach out to the Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation community and Employee's to let all know that we have NARCAN kits for reversal of opioid overdose. During this pandemic the overdose deaths have increased with opioid addiction. You may be able to save a person's life with the NARCAN opioid reversal kit. There is a training on how to use the NARCAN on YouTube, **NARCAN training video - Instructions for administration of NARCAN® Nasal Spray 4mg** is the name of the video training on how to administer NARCAN. 




