# **TOLOWA DEE-NI' NATION SECURES FALLEN K'VSH-CHU**

On December 30, 2020 a large k'vsh-chu fell across Howland Hill Rd. in Crescent City, CA. Our Tribal Council learned of the fallen k'vs-chu via a social media post by the Redwood National and State ye' (redwood roots) that were exposed before the stump was cut Parks. This area of our Tolowa ancestral land is now managed by the California Department of Parks and Recreation as part of the Jedediah Smith State Park. By direction of Tribal Council, the Tribal Historic Preservation Officer sent a letter to the CA State Parks Superintendent requesting the k'vsh-chu for traditional cultural purposes. The Superintendent agreed to the request and was very supportive of the Nation's efforts to obtain as much of the fallen k'vs-chu as feasible for the Nation to transport.

Howland Hill Rd. was closed until the tree could be cleared from the roadway. Due to the holiday season the Nation and CA State Park Staff had to wait until after the New Year to begin work cutting and removing the tree. The main tree was approximately 6ft in diameter with an additional offshoot tree approximately 4ft diameter. The large size and good condition of both will allow us to use a majority of the acquired k'vsh-chu to construct xee-nvs, traditional dugout canoes and possibly other cultural projects. After the logs have properly seasoned the plan is to host trainings for our young men to learn the art and skill of canoe carving. This is very exciting news as there has not been canoes constructed by Tolowa people in at least the last two generations, if not more.

In addition to men collecting the logs for xee-nvs, a small group of female basket weavers were able to salvage some k'vs-chu weeand tipped back into the root-ball hole. K'vsh-chu wee-ye' are typically limited in use for ceremonial baskets that are used for prayer and rituals such as Nee-dash (Feather Dance), Lhuk Miinaa~-li (Salmon Ceremony) and Ch'a~lh-day-wvn Srdee-yvn (Flower Dance).





The Tribal Historic Preservation Officer will work with tribal members to submit the permit applications to the proper staff at CA State Parks.






#### **Our Teachers are Rocking It**

# Reservation Deadline for Bags: Monday, February 8th

The Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation will be hosting an elder meat distribution. This year's bags will include chis-chu svn' (elk meat) and lhuk svn' (fish meat). Typically bags contain a variety of other meat sourced from our local Fairs; however, this source was unavailable to be secured in 2020, due to COVID-19. Despite limited sources of meat the Tribe is still hosting a distribution.

Tribal staff and community members under the guidance of the Natural Resources Department salvage and process chis-chu throughout the year from a variety of opportunistic sources. In addition, through the Rowdy Creek Fish Hatchery, the Tribe for the first time has salvaged and processed lhuk for consumption. The goal of these efforts is to increase tribal citizens' access to traditional foods.

<u>All tribal elders</u> (tribal citizens ≥55yrs) are eligible to receive a bag this year. Bags will be available for pickup on Wednesday, February 10th, from 10am-2pm at Xaa-wan'-k'wvt Hall Community Center. If you are an interested tribal elder, <u>You must reserve your bag no later than Monday February 8th</u>. Bags must be picked up at the designated time and place. Limited local deliveries may be accommodated upon request.




# What can I drop off for recycling and where?

# **Curry County Recycling Buy Back**

Curry County recycling redemption is limited to using Bottle Drop locations for beverage containers. The redemption value per container is \$.10. The good news is that 90% of these containers are actually recycled since only glass, aluminum, and plastic beverage containers are accepted. Recycling through Bottle Drop eliminates problems associated with curbside pickup and drop-off locations that often contain items that are contaminated with residual food and/or items that cannot be recycled.

#### You may be eligible for some of the following programs: •

#### **Burial Assistance:**

#### Available to all Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation Tribal Citizens

 There is a max allowance of \$3,500 for assistance. IF, there are funds left over, the remaining balance may be awarded to an heir, or next of kin to the deceased.

#### **Catastrophic Emergency Assistance:**

Available to Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation Tribal Citizens who reside in our 5 county service area ONLY (Coos, Curry, Josephine, Del Norte and Humboldt)

- Payment may be provided to individuals or families who suffer fire, flood, or other destruction of their home and loss or damage to personal possessions. TDN will make payments only for essential needs and other non-medical necessities.
  - ◊ TDN Citizen must be 18 years and older
  - Primary residence of the applicant, provide verification
  - Primary residence is within the 5 county service area
  - Apply within two (2) weeks of home disaster

#### **Elder Emergency Assistance:**

Available to Tolowa Dee-ni' Nation Tribal Citizens who reside in our 5 county service area ONLY (Coos, Curry, Josephine, Del Norte and Humboldt)

Completed and accepted applications will be eligible for a
maximum allowance of \$500 per calendar year, to use towards an
emergency situation. Requests should be discussed with CFS staff
before purchase of any items to allow us to verify the need for a
replacement item. If an elder purchases fuel or similar items and
wishes to apply for reimbursement, this must be within two (2)
weeks of purchase.

#### **General Assistance:**

Available to Tolowa Dee-ni' Tribal Citizens who reside in our 5 county service area ONLY (Coos, Curry, Josephine, Del Norte and Humboldt)

Provides financial assistance to eligible Tribal Citizens with a goal

to increase self-sufficiency. This is accomplished through specific steps an individual will take to increase independence as outlined in his/her Individual Self-Sufficiency Plan (ISP)

\*May receive up to three (3) months of assistance per calendar year.

**Medical Assistance** (includes hospitalization, medical travel and consecutive/long-term therapy):

#### Available to all Tolowa Dee-ni' Tribal Citizens

Medical Assistance Grant Awards, annual maximum allowance shall not exceed \$750.

- \$75 for trips one-way from 50 199 miles, or \$150 for trips oneway from 200 + miles, from a Tribal Citizens home.
- Payments are not made retro actively; Tribal Citizens have the responsibility to request assistance prior to appointment date, or in the case of an emergency, ten (10) business days of the appointment.
- Hospitalization Assistance: Available for members or their spouse who are hospitalized. Members or their spouses are eligible for \$100 a day after a verified hospitalization of three (3) consecutive days; up to, and not to exceed, \$1,000 for inpatient treatment. Limited to one per calendar year per member.
- Consecutive Treatment/Long Term Therapy: available for certain life threatening conditions including, but not limited to, cancer, renal failure, neurological disorders and coronary heart disease. Limited to one per calendar year per member.

#### NCIDC LIHEAP- Energy Assistance: Contact Monica Calvillo Available to Tolowa Dee-ni' Tribal Citizens who reside in Del Norte or Humboldt County ONLY

- Tribal Citizen must complete an NCIDC LIHEAP application and submit information specified on application; along with energy bill.
- NCIDC will verify information, approve or deny request.

#### Mental Health and Substance Abuse during the pandemic.

The Substance Abuse Program has resources available for services during this pandemic era. We now have some resources to assist. 
**Multidisciplinary Teams:** The MDT project is helping us develop better responses for children, families and adults who are crime victims by creating MDTs and holistic case plans with victim advocacy. We have completed a series of staff trainings from the National Indian Child Welfare Association (Working with Substance Abusing Families, Child Protective Teams and Forensic Interviewing); National Native Child Trauma Center (Trauma Informed Case Management); "Being a Good Relative: An Old Path Toward Trauma Informed Care" presentation by the Indian Country Child Trauma Center. The MDT meets every week.

**Positive Indian Parenting-** CFS is working with the National Indian Child Welfare Association to develop a program for Tolowa families that is two-fold: Group Parenting Classes and Individual One to One Coaching.

PIP focuses on traditional and culturally specific parenting practices and values. We will explore attitudes in a variety of traditional child-rearing ways and apply them to values and challenges of modern parenting skills. We are working with the National Indian Child Welfare Association to develop a "parent coach" approach to working with families one to one. **Child Victim Advocacy Project** is continuing to provide services virtually and telephonically through the COVID-19 pandemic. Services we provide include Crisis Support- emergency food, clothing and shelter assistance. Transportation, medical accompaniment, and assistance with completing agency forms; Criminal Justice Support- court and appointment accompaniment, transportation, advocacy on behalf of the child victim, and crisis intervention. Culturally-centered therapies- art therapy, and peer support to promote resiliency and emotional healing and wellness. Cultural youth group activities provided by contracted cultural specialists- regalia making, practices and protocols, storytelling, and language, just to name a few. Ongoing case management- safety planning, identification of resources available to the victim, counseling, referral and support advocacy. **Behavioral Health Services**: We recently received a grant from the U.S. Dept. of Justice, Office of Victim Crime to reduce the effects of historic and personal trauma by helping adults, children and families stabilize parent-child relations and increase involvement of the community through mental health services and wellness activities. We are currently in Phase 1 of implementation.


