Town Project Update

The Town's Engineering Department has been extremely busy coordinating several capital projects in the community. We are excited to be increasing the safety of our residents and bringing upgrades and needed maintenance to existing parks and facilities.

Yucca Valley Elementary School Sidewalk, Project No. 8967

- Construction of sidewalk, curb & gutter, match up asphalt and handicapped ramps on the north and south sides of Pueblo Trail, from Hopi Tr. to Bannock Tr.
- Plans are approved, with additional review expected from Caltrans.
- This project will be under construction and completed in 2019, pending coordination with HDWD Package D project.


Yucca TrailSH Warren Vista to Palomar Avenue, Project No. 8971

- Adding 8' wide paved shoulders and painted/striped median islands, on Yucca Trail, between Warren Vista Avenue and Palomar
- Currently in the preliminary engineering stage
- · Being funded by Federal dollars

Yucca Trail and Palomar Intersection

- This project includes the installation of new mast arms, signal heads, and poles, at the existing signalized intersection, as well as lane widenings north/south of the intersection on Palomar, to provide protected left hand turn movements.
- This project is currently being designed, and will be bid, concurrently with the Yucca Trail HSIP project; this project is being funded with Town funds, not Federal funds.

• Construction bidding is anticipated in late 2019 or early 2020, based upon the HSIP schedule and Caltrans approvals.



2019 Crack Seal Project

 The annual town-wide application of crack sealant to the cracks in the pavement is currently underway and should be completed by the end of May 2019. The streets identified will be further treated during the 2019/20 Slurry Seal Project.

Annual Slurry Seal Project

- The annual slurry seal project is out to bid.
- The slurry seal contract is scheduled for award in June and project completion prior to September 1, 2019.
- Funding for the annual slurry project is by SB 1 (Gas Tax), and Measure Y

Private Land Development

There are many projects currently being considered within the Town. Below is a listing of just a few.

Prescott Plaza (CUP 03-18) Twentynine Palms Hwy (North) Between Hanford and Prescott	Proposed construction of two, 5,0000 square foot restaurants, a service station, a 3,010 convenience store, and 18,000 square feet of retail space.
El Cielo Campground (CUP 02-18) 10 acres at 58225 Brown Drive	Proposed development of a cabin campground with 13 cabins under 400 square feet each, including manager's quarters, clubhouse, and restroom facilities.
Under Canvas Campground (PA 02-18) 40 acres of a 640 acre property at the SW corner of San Andreas Road and Warren Vista Ave.	Proposed luxury campground to include canvas tents, bathroom trailers, reception/dining tent, a mobile kitchen trailer, pool, and yoga deck.
Dutch Bros Coffee (PA 07-18) 57037 Twentynine Palms Hwy SE corner of Hwy 62 and Barberry	Proposed 820 square foot drive thru coffee shop.
